## Ingram Clean Air

The Valley is home to the largest Gold Tier Dark Sky Park in Europe (Source: NNPA 2023). This is due to the low light pollution in the area.

Sustainable farming helps to keep the air clean and makes the farm the perfect place to stay overnight at our Star Barn.



## Clean & Plentiful Water

Home to one of Britain's Cleanest Rivers in the Tranquillity of Northumberland National Park.

The river Breamish is home to migrating salmon and sea trout and to otters and other wildlife.

The River is a SSSI Site of Special Scientific Interest.

## Thriving Plants & Wildlife

The high quality water courses on the farm encourages the migration of salmon and sea trout to breed upstream and is home to otters and other wildlife such as breeding wader habitats.

The farm has a designated breeding wader management program which is to conserve and enhance the environment for some of our rarest breeding waders such as Curlews and Lapwing.

The valley also has a thriving Red Squirrel habitat, one of the few remaining Red Squirrel habitats in England.

Sheep, cattle, and red deer are sustainably reared on the farm.

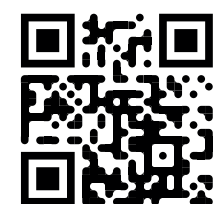
## Protection from and Mitigation of hazards

We work closely with the National Park, Natural England, The Tweed Forum and The Environment Agency to minimize the flood risk in the local area, caused by water runoff from the steep sides of the valley, by farming using sustainable land management practices.

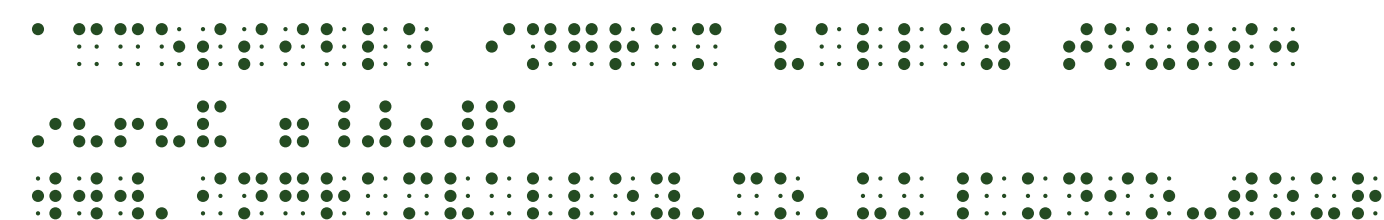
## Mitigation and Adaptation to Climate Change

Ingram Valley Farm works to support carbon sequestration (removing carbon from the atmosphere) by using sustainable farming practices. Carbon soil audits are available upon request.
